## SPECIFICATION FOR ESTABLISHMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF AN AVIATION MUSEUM

#### 1. INTRODUCTION:

Gateway Airport Authority Limited (GAAL) seeks to appoint a suitable, qualified, reputable, and experienced service provider to develop an aviation museum to showcase aircraft, artifacts, interactive exhibits and educational content that highlight the evolution of aviation locally.

#### 2. SCOPE OF WORK

- ✓ Electrical fitting for plugs and lights refer to annexure 1.
- ✓ Exhibit design and fabrication (including digital and interactive displays)
- ✓ Installation of exhibits and audiovisual systems
- ✓ Art effects and displays for the showrooms
- ✓ Rails on the wings

#### a) Visual Art Installations

These provide aesthetic appeal, inspire imagination, and celebrate aviation culture.

- Murals & Wall Art: Large-scale paintings depicting historic flights, famous pilots, or aviation innovations.
- Sculptures: Indoor or outdoor sculptures of aircraft, propellers, pilots, or birds in flight.
- Metalwork Art: Recycled airplane parts shaped into decorative or symbolic forms.
- Silhouettes & Stencils: Aircraft silhouettes on floors, walls, or ceilings for visual continuity.

#### b) Multimedia & Digital Art

Immersive and interactive media that engage visitors in storytelling and education.

 Projection Mapping: Dynamic video projections on models or walls showing flight simulations or historical re-enactments.

- Augmented Reality (AR): Apps or tablets that overlay digital content (like cockpit views or x-ray aircraft anatomy) onto real exhibits.
- Virtual Reality (VR): Simulated flight experiences, air battles, or historic events.
- Interactive Touchscreens: Digital storytelling with timelines, quizzes, and multimedia exhibits.

#### c) Graphic Design & Exhibition Design

Visual communication elements that support wayfinding, learning, and exhibit cohesion.

- Infographics: Diagrams explaining aircraft mechanics, flight physics, or timelines of aviation history.
- Typography & Signage: Distinctive fonts and icons modeled on cockpit instruments or vintage posters.
- Backlit Panels & LED Displays: Highlighted narratives, pilot stories, or world aviation milestones.
- Exhibit Labeling & Panels: Professionally designed placards with text, diagrams, and photos.

#### d) Thematic & Atmospheric Effects

These art effects build the mood and enhance immersion.

- Soundscapes: Background audio like propeller hum, pilot chatter, jet engines, or air traffic control.
- Dioramas: Realistic miniature scenes of hangars, aircraft carriers, or airfields.
- Set Design: Replicas of cockpits, hangars, or air traffic towers to create immersive walkthroughs.
- Lighting Effects: Ambient or spot lighting that simulates day/night flying conditions or highlights aircraft contours.

#### e) Educational & Children's Art Areas

Engaging art-based activities for younger visitors and families.

 Art Stations: Interactive drawing or coloring zones where kids can design their own aircraft.

- Puppet or Animation Displays: Simple, storytelling art for younger audiences.
- Aviation-Themed Crafts: Model-making, paper planes, or badge-making activities.
- f) Commemorative & Historical Art

Honoring individuals, events, or milestones.

- Portrait Galleries: Paintings or digital portraits of notable aviators and aerospace pioneers.
- Memorial Walls: Artistic tributes to fallen pilots, war veterans, or aviation trailblazers.
- Historical Posters & Reproductions: Vintage airline ads, WWII recruitment posters, or aerospace innovation announcements.

#### 2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

#### 3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

#### 3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

#### 3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

## 3.2. FORMULAE FOR DISPOSAL OR LEASING OF STATE ASSETS AND INCOME GENERATING PROCUREMENT

#### 3.2.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

#### 4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
  - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10
    preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to
    determine the applicable preference point system; or
  - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,

then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.

Table 1: Specific goals for the tender and points claimed are indicated per the table below.

(Note to organs of state: Where either the 90/10 or 80/20 preference point system is applicable, corresponding points must also be indicated as such.

    - (b) recover costs, losses or damages it has incurred or suffered as a result of that person's conduct;
    - (c) cancel the contract and claim any damages which it has suffered as a result

- of having to make less favourable arrangements due to such cancellation;
- (d) Recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
